

Grade Level Updates



Both Pre-K classes are preparing for our "Summer Vacation" theme, and we are going on a field trip to the Berglund Center to get up close and personal with big trucks.

Kindergarten

In May, Kindergarten will begin their end of year countdown days that include many educational and fun activities to celebrate the end of kindergarten. We will also begin preparing for our promotion ceremony that will take place on June 5th.

First

First grade is going to Lick Run Farms to celebrate our Farm to School learning and learn more about plants. We will tour the farm, plant, craft and picnic in the park. Big thanks to Bloom for catering our picnic lunch!

Second

In May, we will work on these math standards: 2.12 Symmetry and 2.8 Length and weight. In social studies, we will continue learning about famous Americans' contributions to the world. We will also study economics concepts. In science, we will investigate products made from plants. Our reading/writing lessons continue to center around how people can respond to injustice.

Third STARS

We have the much-anticipated Sea Quest field trip! Students start their studies of ancient civilizations next. In math and language arts we are busy reviewing this year's content. Lots of multiplication, fractions, and adding/subtracting 4-digit numbers!

Continue to discuss the importance of trying their best on all review activities and on the day of the SOL test. After the SOL testing window is over, we will dive into some fun science projects, deeper exploration in VA studies, and prepare students for some of the topics they will be covering in fifth grade.
