Grade Level Updates



Preschool

Preschool is learning all about how to keep a healthy and safe body. We are talking about healthy eating, exercise, and the people in our communities who keep us safe like doctors, crossing guards, and firefighters!

Kindergarten

In reading we are beginning to use our letter knowledge to read and spell words. We are also learning new heart words and encourage families to practice these at home. In math we are focusing on counting to 100 and writing/identifying teen numbers. In science and social studies, we will be exploring our five senses and learning about Thanksgiving.

First

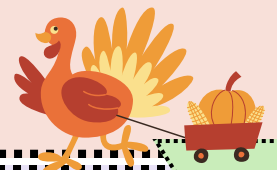
First grade will be digging into living systems, geometry and data. We will use the unit, "Am I Alive?" to learn about living and non-living things. We will finish up our module on Book Around the World and understanding how books change our lives.

Second

In 2nd grade we are beginning to work on vowel teams when reading multi-syllable words. In science we are exploring all things magnetic in our force's unit. We are extending our addition and subtraction skills along with learning about equivalent values in math. As a reminder, please focus on reading for at least 15 minutes in the evening with your child.

Third STARS

We are working on Multiplication and Division and in Reading we are continuing our Ocean Unit and we will start be starting Space Unit and we are finishing Ancient China and then moving on to Ancient Egypt.



Third PLATO

Third graders have begun their multiplication unit. Flashcards are a great way for families to get involved. Start slowly with the 1s, 5s & 10s then move onto the 2s. We will begin our study of Ancient Egypt in November. Parents, be on the lookout for a study guide to come home soon.

Fourth STARS

We have started our amazing journey into poetry by writing some of our own poems, as well as reading a variety of poems in class. In Virginia Studies, we are beginning our study of the Native American Language Groups and State Recognized Tribes. For math, we are tackling estimation, multiplication, and problem solving - continue to work on multiplication facts at home with your student to build their fluency!

Fourth PLATO

The 4th grade PLATO group will return from our Jamestown trip to discuss the historic developments of English colonization. Students will have an eyewitness perspective of the setting for *Blood on the River*.

Fifth STARS

In Language Arts, our 5th grade Stars are continuing to learn about reading elements, how to develop a well written response, and how to apply background knowledge to articles that coincide with our novel. In Science, we have begun our unit on Virginia Resources, and in Math, we are focusing on numerical patterns and will move on to fraction, decimal relations. Please keep up the good work of completing the homework!

Fifth PLATO

In 5P, we'll be comparing and ordering fractions and decimals. In writing, we're shifting our focus from state research projects to writing opinion essays.
